Amy Harris is the director of the University of Michigan Museum of Natural History. She has more than 30 years' experience in the administration of cultural organizations and museums. For the past 10 years, Amy led the museum through a process of reinvention as the museum moved from the beloved but well-worn former museum

building into a state-of-the-art science research facility. Amy oversaw the development of all-new exhibits and educational programs featuring the university's world-class natural science collections, cutting edge research by U-M faculty, and interdisciplinary topics of global and local concern.

Amy began her museum career at the Art Institute of Chicago where she worked as the curatorial research assistant in the Department of Textiles. She then moved to Michigan and worked at the Ann Arbor Summer Festival, advancing in responsibility until she was named Development Director.

Amy's first job at the U-M Museum of Natural History in 1996 was as the museum's first-ever Development Officer. She was promoted to Associate Director in 1998 and became Interim Director in 2000. She was appointed Museum Director in 2002.

Amy has a Bachelor's degree in Comparative Literature from Cornell University and a Master's degree in the History of Art from the University of Michigan. In her presentation, Amy will discuss the museum's history and transformation as well as its future plans.


