#### **NATIONAL NEWS**



This is not a drill: the U.S. Senate has committed to voting this week on the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) for the first time in 40 years! The vote would remove an arbitrary ratification deadline and recognize the ERA as part of the Constitution.

<u>Tell your senators: equality in the Constitution is not up for debate, support the ERA now!</u>

While the advancement of women's equality has continued, sex discrimination does not have the same legal protection as other constitutional classes, such as race, religion, or nationality. And as we have seen over the past year, how women's equality under law can be changed or even revoked at the whim of legislators and judges.

The Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) would provide, once and for all, the constitutional guarantee that all men and women are truly equal under the law and that these rights cannot easily be abridged.

The ERA needs your support for its historic day in Congress —<u>tell your</u> senators to vote in favor of Senate Joint Resolution 4!
