Women's Equality Day

I attended the annual Women's Equality Day event in Livonia. This event was hosted by the AAUW in partnership with BPW and several other groups.

Women and male allies gathered to celebrate the adoption of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution on August 26, 1920. As noted by the emcee, this gave white women the right to vote, but still left minority women out in the cold.

There were many AAUW members from other clubs at the luncheon, but I believe I was the only person from the Jackson branch. I picked up some AAUW swag to help me stay organized.

AAUW President Sheila Blair gave a nice summary to get us warmed up to the topic of the day—advocating for women and girls.

Laura Callow, nicknamed the "Susan B. Anthony of Michigan," said there is a lot of momentum behind equity issues due to recent events. She is hopeful that this means we can get the 28th Amendment over these final hurdles in Congress.

Meghan Kissell, AAUW's Senior Director of Public Policy and Member Advocacy, brought us up to speed on the work of the DC Lobby Corps. They are working on getting more signatures on the discharge petition to release the joint resolution for a vote by the US House of Representatives. HJ Res 25 will remove the deadline on the ERA.

State Rep. Laurie Pohutsky (D-Livonia), Speaker Pro Tempore of the Michigan House of Representatives, shared what is happening to support the ERA in Lansing. The Michigan House approved Concurrent Resolution 4 back in March. Now it's sitting in the Michigan Senate in committee awaiting the legislators to return from summer recess.

The resolution says the Michigan Legislature calls on the Archivist of the United States to certify and publish the Equal Rights Amendment as the Twenty-Eighth Amendment to the United States Constitution and calling on the United States Congress to declare the Equal Rights Amendment ratified.
