# Status of Reproductive Justice Bills, Michigan Legislature

# **Summary**

- 15 reproductive justice bills signed into law including the three lead bills to <u>repeal the</u> <u>criminalization of abortion</u> from 1931 (HB 4006, 4032, and SB 2).
- 12 bills enrolled in the last days of this year's session and on their way to the Governor for signature.
   Among those are the 9 <u>Reproductive Health Act bills</u>, HBs 4949, 4951, 4953, 4954, 4955, 4956, SBs 474, 476, and 477 repealing many of the laws that anti-abortion lawmakers enacted over the last 40 years.
  - Due to the opposition of one House Democrat, Karen Whitsett of Detroit, the RHA as adopted did not include the bills repealing the 24-hour waiting period or the ban on Medicaid funding for abortions. Repeal of the parental consent law was not even included in the RHA package of bills.
  - Laws that may be considered unconstitutional under the 2022 Reproductive Freedom for All constitutional amendment could be subject to a litigation challenge.
- 22 bills have passed the first chamber and are awaiting second chamber consideration.
- 9 bills reported by the first chamber committee are awaiting full first chamber consideration.
- 7 bills having had hearings in first chamber committee, but not yet reported by the committee; and
- 46 bills (some anti-choice) introduced and not yet considered by committee.
